#### **Class Placements**

All class placements at Kincumber Public School are made taking into account such factors as:

- Number of students
- Gender balance
- Requests by parents or teachers for placement in a certain class
- The placement of students with special needs
- Friendship groups

While this list is not intended to be exhaustive, other factors may be considered by school executive when placing students into classes. School staff are currently planning classes for 2010. By the end of the year we should have tentatively placed all children in classes, allocated staff and identified classrooms. I hope to be able to provide you with that information by Monday 14 December. Whenever possible and practicable, and where a student may benefit from a move, a child may change classes at the request of a parent or school executive. The move should not compromise school organisation nor disadvantage other students. Most class moves will take place at the beginning of the school year when numbers are likely to change. After class numbers are finalised we would anticipate few moves. All requests from parents should be directed to the Principal in writing.

#### **School Development Days**

Students have their last day of school on 16 December. On 17 & 18 December school staff will participate in professional learning activities focussed on writing, OHS, child protection, technology and CPR. Both days are pupil free days for school staff. Parents requiring care for their children on these two days, and in the following week up until 23 December, should register with our OOSH service as soon as possible to ensure supervision. #### **Sun Safety**

Children are at school five days out of seven during periods of high UV radiation. For this reason we require children to wear a broad brimmed or legionnaires style hat. The Cancer Council recommends that students take responsibility for their own sun protection including wearing sunscreen. Parents can support the school's sun protection strategies by ensuring that their children have an appropriate hat; applying sunscreen before coming to school and carrying their own personal sunscreen for use at school. Students may also wear sunglasses in the playground. Children without a hat must play in the shade (the COLA for primary students). Students who repeatedly avoid sport or PE because they don't bring a hat will be dealt with under the school's discipline policy. Please help us to meet our legal responsibilities in our duty of care.




