#### From the Principal continued;

Children cannot access social media via the school internet. However, with many students bringing mobile devices to school for phone or messaging use with parent permission, an increasing problem is student use of social media at school from children's personal mobile devices. Any student logging into the school network, agrees to abide by an acceptable use code and we suspend access when students breach their agreement.

I urge all parents to:

- be aware of their children's online presence and regularly check activity;
- avoid getting involved yourself and responding online to other children;
- find out more about how to talk to children about cyber safety and cyber bullying; and
- tell us if your child is having problems because of inappropriate online use.

Although reminding parents of their responsibilities is a difficult issue to raise, we have your child's best interests as our top priority. Thank you for your support as we tackle this tricky subject.

#### Reduce, reuse and recycle

Children from Kincumber Public School look for ways to do this every single day. Soon they will be the first school on the Central Coast to use recycled water to irrigate their school grounds.

With a grant from the Central Coast Water Savings Fund, a lot of help from Gosford City Council's Water Project Officer, Wayne Quennelle and Peter Carroll from environmental organisation SCRAP – the school has installed a state of the art underground watering system that uses recycled water from the Kincumber treatment works.

The project will be officially launched here tomorrow after school and is expected to save thousands of litres of the coast's valuable drinking water by making use of the world's latest water recycling and water delivery technologies.


