Sport next year

We're sports mad here at Kincumber and we enter a lot of events including Primary Schools Sports Association knockout competitions. These teams are formed by a selection process and preference is given to Year 6 first, then Year 5 and so on.

Currently we compete in the Brisbane Water zone for athletics, swimming etc as well as knockout comps against 21 other schools. At a recent meeting principals and teachers of the four zones on the Central Coast discussed ways to increase teacher and principal involvement in PSSA sport and to increase opportunities for students.

We had preliminary discussions about affiliating with the Woy Woy zone which has only 7 schools including Pretty Beach PS. A move to Woy Woy zone would enable more of our students to compete at regional level and increase the number of teachers able to support sport.

A possible move was discussed and ultimately supported in principle at the last P & C meeting. The P & Cs at our partner primary schools will also be discussing this and if it is supported, then we can look forward to some terrific sporting opportunities.

From the Principal continued; Recycled water

Last week I said that Kincumber Public School will be the first school on the Central Coast to use recycled water to irrigate their school grounds. Well, I was wrong – we are actually the first school in Australia.

At last weeks official launch last Friday, Year 5 students did a great job of presenting the recycled water project to their peers and after school to a VIP audience, where we learned we were the first!

You can already see the difference to the school playing fields. A large working model of the underground system is being held at school to demonstrate the great benefits of using recycled water. Wet weather parking problems

Wet weather always means extra traffic in Kimbarra Close and sometimes means rule-breaking from drivers. Here are some simple tips to make it safer for the children and less stressful for the adults.

Safety tips for drivers using a 'Drop-off and Pick-up' area

- Always drop-off or pick-up your child from the designated area
- Drivers should remain in their vehicles at all times in the 'Drop-off and Pick-up' area.
- Make sure children use the footpath-side door when getting in and out of a car.
- Make sure the hand brake is applied when the vehicle is stationery.
- Never double park.
- Never park across a pedestrian crossing.
- Never undertake a U-turn in close proximity to the school.

Safety tips for students

- Stay buckled up until the vehicle has stopped in the 'Drop-off and Pick-up' area.
- Make sure your school bag and other items are in a safe position, eg on the floor.
- Be ready to get out of the car with your belongings when the car has stopped and you have unbuckled your seatbelt.
- Always get in and out of the backseat of the vehicle through the safety door – the rear footpath -side door.

Term IV - are you bored after school?




